

Canopy

One of the biggest considerations was to draw bigger acts which was addressed, in part, by including several dressing rooms, shower facilities, and green rooms. Additional wing space also gives larger acts the ability to provide standout lighting and sound, including two 12'x18' monitors flanking the stage. Permanent folding

### Finishes

The metal plate panels, which are arranged in an elongated mosaic pattern and illuminated by LED lighting, provide a sense of drama and even movement to the canopy.







Cultural Hub

# TCU AMPHITHEATER Seating

The amphitheater provides covered seating for 3,000 patrons, with the lawn area accommodating additional 4,000 patrons.





Site Considerations

The site which was a brownfield redevelopment and had at one time been the location of a pig slaughterhouse, had been backfilled over the years to create the existing seating bowl for the amphitheater. The design team made very little modifications to the site and grading and addressed issues and concerns that cropped up, following subsurface exploratory and laboratory testing reports, by adopting innovative foundation and structural design methods and practices.
