### NON-TRADITIONAL PROJECTS

**After Architecture** earned a Citation Award for the Sylvan Scrapple in Columbus. Sylvan Scrapple responds to specific site conditions with transferable tactics: urban activation, robotic construction, mass timber, reuse, and public engagement. **B**

### H. ROLL MCLAUGHLIN 25-YEAR AWARD

**RATIO** earned the H. Roll McLaughlin 25-Year Award for the Christel DeHaan Fine Arts Center. The Fine Arts Center continues its original purpose of empowering cultural growth and equitable connections to the world of art through its diverse population of students, faculty, guest performers, and community. **G**

### INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE

**One 10 STUDIO Architects** earned a Citation Award for its Compact Contemporary. The architects incorporated a clean design with a sleek and contemporary feel throughout this northern Indiana lake house. **I**

**Haus | Architecture for Modern Lifestyles** received a Merit Award for its Thornhurst Kitchen Revival, drawing on the legacy of Avriel Shull while optimizing the space for contemporary living and entertaining. **H**

### NEW CONSTRUCTION *project cost less than \$5 million*

**Haus | Architecture for Modern Lifestyles** earned a Merit Award for Holly Creek Overlook, a new 3,000 square-foot home along the Monon Trail in Indianapolis that is enveloped by a natural, wooded habitat, providing a serene and picturesque backdrop that harmonizes seamlessly with the surrounding environment. **F**

### PRESERVATION/ ADAPTATIVE REUSE/ RENOVATION

**CSO** earned a Citation Award for 220 Meridian. CSO dramatically transformed the 22-story, 50-year-old, former AT&T headquarters, demonstrating how cities can stem the oversupply of office properties by converting them to mixed-use projects, creating new opportunities to live, work and play downtown. **C**

**arcDesign** received a Merit Award for the IUPUI Health Sciences/Dunlap Building that is now a lively hub for student learning, training and collaboration in the health sciences. **E**

**StudioAXIS** earned an Honor Award for its stunning renovation of the Michigan Farm Bureau, banishing uninspired beige workstations and creating an interactive workspace, resulting in a “gem of a project,” according to the jurors. **D**

**DKGR** received a Merit Award for its redesign of Number 15, a five-floor entertainment venue in downtown Louisville. Number 15 stands as a beacon of cultural revival and local pride at the site of a former distillery. **M**

### NEW CONSTRUCTION *project cost greater than \$5 million*

Cedar Shores House is nestled among 100 year-old trees with sweeping views of Grandview Lake in Columbus. Designed by **One 10 STUDIO Architects**, this Honor Award-winning private residence is an intimate home for two that is also a hub for entertaining family and friends. **A**

**krM Architecture** earned a Merit Award for its design of the Anderson Transit Station, which is increasing equitable transportation access, fortifying the urban environment, and spurring further investments in downtown Anderson. **J**

**krM Architecture** received a Merit Award for the new Glendale Branch of the Indianapolis Public Library. Located on the site of a former elementary school, the library offers shared outdoor gathering spaces, connects to existing heritage trees, and blends in with the neighborhood with its limestone and concrete exterior. **L**

**American Structurepoint** earned a Citation Award for its design of the new \$51 million, 70,000 square foot Lafayette Public Safety Center, where safety, privacy and community engagement were key considerations with this design. **K**

## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS MONTH BY MONTH

2024 marked a year of robust programming that enhanced professional development through monthly educational sessions, strengthened community connections through civic engagement, advanced sustainability initiatives, preserved architectural heritage, promoted diversity in leadership, and fostered regional collaboration.

### FEBRUARY

**Architects and Civics** / At Ball State University's CAP|Indy, members engaged in vital discussions about professional civic engagement. The program spotlighted architects volunteering with youth programs, serving on public boards, and working with public servants, emphasizing our profession's role in community leadership.



### MARCH

**White River Vision Implementation** / Hosted at the Historic Athenaeum's Basile Theatre, this program explored Indianapolis' evolving relationship with the White River. Following a landmark delegation visit to Singapore in November 2023, leaders shared insights on waterfront development and its potential application to the White River Vision Plan, connecting public space with regional identity.

### APRIL

**Historic Preservation Excellence** / Returning to CAP|Indy, Louis Joyner, AIA, presented the compelling renovation of First Christian Church's Tower in Columbus, IN. The presentation highlighted the Saarinen's architectural legacy while detailing the technical challenges and discoveries of this significant preservation project.

### MAY

**Indianapolis Motor Speedway Day** / A record-breaking attendance marked this year's traditional IMS event, featuring special guests Al Unser, Jr. and Dave "The King" Wilson. Sponsored by Patterson Horth, the program combined professional education with networking over classic Indiana fare.

### JUNE

**Placemaking Panel Discussion** / Hosted at bo-mar Industries, this third annual event featured an expert panel led by 2024 AIA Indianapolis President Jason Larrison, AIA. Industry leaders discussed successful placemaking strategies, emphasizing collaborative approaches to public space design and management.

Currently the City Architect at the City of Indianapolis, **Marlee Cawthorn, AIA**, leads efforts to enhance the quality of design in Indianapolis, including spearheading the update to the City’s Regional Center Design Guidelines with input from 125 key stakeholders.

At Blackline, she helped design over 315 affordable housing units across Indiana, and at ONE 10 Studio, she focused on single-family homes and small-scale commercial projects. Her work has earned awards and recognition ranging from London, Indiana, and Los Angeles.

Active in the local architecture community, Marlee has served on the AIA Indianapolis Executive Committee since 2022 and is currently Vice President. She also serves on the Board of Rebuilding Together Indianapolis, helping to repair homes for low-income residents.

The firm has won countless awards for its work across a wide spectrum of disciplines, including health care, science and technology, military facilities, and community spaces.

The firm's culture of giving back permeates through its work with partners, clients and the community at large. Its employees engage in meaningful volunteer work through GUIDON GIVES. Guidonnaires volunteer both their time and dollars toward causes they are passionate about with the potential for the firm to match charitable donations.

When **William A. Browne, Jr. FAIA** returned to Indianapolis in 1979 after earning professional degrees in architecture and historic preservation, the city skyline as we know it today did not exist. As Bill settled in, his unique acumen for large, complex downtown reuse projects flourished, just as Indianapolis was reinventing our reputation and our relevance.

Bill founded his business in 1982, and created RATIO based on the idea of reason and thoughtfulness. There are no named partners or designers on the door, just an easily accessible studio and a name that would become recognizable as the place for a new generation of designers that wanted to make their city a better place to live, work and play.

It took partnerships, bipartisanship, creativity and grit, but the city transformed. And Bill Browne has been in the middle of it all, leaving an indelible imprint across the local, state and national architectural community.



The Indiana Convention Center expansion, the Farm Bureau Insurance Headquarters, the NCAA Headquarters expansion, the Anthem Headquarters, the Simon Property Group Headquarters, Market Tower, enhancements to the renowned Children's Museum campus, the Indianapolis Zoo Bicentennial Pavilion and Promenade are all projects where Bill has reshaped the aesthetic of our city and state.

Under his leadership, RATIO has become a premier design practice in the Midwest and created hundreds of jobs, as well as helped Indiana retain talented designers. The firm maintains studios in Chicago, Champaign, Denver, Raleigh and Milwaukee, with more than 220 employees and projects across the globe. It has earned public recognition and national awards and helped position Indiana as a destination, rather than a flyover state.

Bill believes that preservation maintains the vitality of a place, and it is crucial to being a responsible steward of one's city. That's why he has dedicated his efforts to historic preservation, including the Indianapolis Historic Preservation Commission, Riley Area Revitalization, Indiana Landmarks, Historic New Harmony, and the Benjamin Harrison Presidential Site.

At the same time, Bill's community service is exemplary. From leading arts organizations to advocating for downtown growth, to welcoming the Super Bowl, Bill has played a leading role in moving our city forward.

And move the city forward is what he is continuing to do, elevating the design of Indianapolis. Some of his projects include the Signia by Hilton and expansion of the convention center, the Elanco Corporate Global Headquarters, IU Health's new downtown hospital, and the Indiana State archives.

Three architects were honored with the AIA Indiana Architecture Outstanding Service Award.

**Steve Alspaugh, FAIA** has been at the forefront of disaster response through his role as AIA Indiana's State Disaster Coordinator, where he supports the I-BEAM team in disaster response efforts across the state. Steve recruits volunteers, educates architects, and provides critical assessments of buildings in affected communities.

**James J. Mladucky, AIA**, is the vice president of design & construction at IU Health, where he is directing the IU Health Medical Center Campus Program, a \$4.5 billion health science campus in the heart of Indianapolis and the largest healthcare project currently under construction in the US. Although Jim has extensive experience in health care design, he turned to Indiana-based architects to design IU Health's flagship campus. He has been a true partner with AIA since he arrived in Indianapolis.

**Scott Pannicke, AIA**, was recognized for his service as a member of the Indiana Fire Prevention & Building Safety Commission. Ensuring the integrity and safety of a structure is absolutely critical, and it was Scott's tenacity that helped Indiana modernize many of its antiquated building codes. Change can be challenging for some, but because of Scott's diligence and dedication, our communities and the people who live there are safer today.




### WOMEN IN ARCHITECTURE

In its second year, AIA Indianapolis' Women in Architecture Committee continued to grow. The committee met regularly to network and build support among women in the profession, including a well-attended Pecha Kucha presentation focused on "What's Your Superpower" in April at DELV Design. The committee also participated in a tour of Indianapolis' Ladywood Estates, which is on the National Register of Historic Places and designed by trailblazer Avriel Shull. In late November, the group gathered for gingerbread house decorating and planning for the 2025 year. The committee is co-chaired by Diana Short, AIA, DELV Design, and Cheryl Wendholt, AIA, Schmidt Associates.



### YOUNG ARCHITECTS FORUM

The AIA Indianapolis Young Architects Forum (YAF) had a very busy year. Programming for 2024 ranged from Fever Games to Breakfast with the AIA Indy Fellows to ARE Study Session to giving back at Gleaners Food Bank. Chaired by Logan Gemmill, AIA, Browning Day and Shorf Afza, Assoc. AIA, Schmidt Associates, this group strives to connect young architects throughout the AIA Indianapolis Section. During this pivotal career phase, it is especially important for young architects to develop a support group of fellow professionals that can sustain and support each other. YAF Indy provides that support for the emerging professionals of AIA Indianapolis.



### NATIONAL AIA SYMPOSIUM HELD IN INDIANAPOLIS

Architects, landscape architects, urban planners, and urban designers from across the country explored Indianapolis and heard from national and local thought leaders during the AIA Regional and Urban Design Symposium on November 14-15.

Led by the AIA's Regional and Urban Design Committee, the symposium focused on polycentric cities, regional connectivity through relationships, and adaptation. Presentations focused on culture and equity, the impact of higher education, innovation districts, scalability in urban design, building resilient designs for the future, and sustainability. AIA Indianapolis welcomed symposium attendees to its November program at the Indiana War Memorial's Pershing Auditorium. A presentation by Amanda Loper, AIA, of David Baker Architects, centered on the recently released publication by her firm, *9 Ways To Make Housing For People*.

Participants also toured downtown Indianapolis and surrounding urban districts, including Fountain Square and Fletcher Place, East Market and Mass Ave., the Indianapolis Cultural Trail, and Indiana Ave. and White River Urban Park.

**ARCHITECTURE WEEK:

During Architecture Week in the spring, AIA Indiana Executive Director Jason Shelley, Hon. AIA penned a letter to the editor encouraging young people to explore careers in architecture. Shelley's letter was shared in several leading Indiana business and local publications.

**THIS ARCHITECTURE WEEK, LET'S ENCOURAGE KIDS TO EXPLORE A CAREER IN ARCHITECTURE**

Growing up in Madison in the 1980s, I was a typical kid in small town Indiana. While my high school offered a number of opportunities to explore potential careers, it was the community's fierce commitment to historic preservation that introduced me to the important role an architect plays in building an environment that is accessible, equitable and safe.

As the executive director of the Indiana Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, I have spent nearly 20 years helping architects grow professionally while also advocating for public policies that protect and improve the value, health, safety and sustainability of Indiana communities.

Nationwide, we need more architects. The architecture field is expected to grow 5% through 2032, faster than the average for all occupations. During Architecture Week (April 14 to 20), we are sending a message to families, schools and community organizations: AIA Indiana is here to partner with you to introduce young people to this rewarding profession.

A pathway to an architecture career exists right here in Indiana. Several universities — Indiana University, Ball State University, Notre Dame University — offer nationally recognized programs with internships and job placement services. Indiana's architecture firms work locally, nationally and internationally, leaving a worldwide legacy.

Our AIA team continues to foster new ways to engage architects at varying stages of their careers. Our Young Architects Forum offers emerging professionals vital connections to seasoned architects, while our Women in Architecture committee is a powerful network of female leaders.

Two of our own Indiana architects have taken a leading role in building the next generation of architects of color. Sanford Garner, FAIA, spearheaded Project Pipeline, a national architectural camp to serve primarily students of color in grades 6 through 8 who attend center-city schools. The foundation overseeing Project Pipeline has received more than \$800,000 to bring the program to 35 cities across the country.

And, Kionna Walker, AIA, is on a mission. With Black female architects making up less than 1% of architects nationwide, Walker founded Next Great Architects, a teaching studio that introduces architecture to children as early as kindergarten and nurtures them through licensure.

AIA Indianapolis, one of AIA Indiana's five sections that span the state, also sponsors an annual design competition among high school students. Now in its 53rd year, the competition engages youth in architecture and provides exposure to design professionals across the state.

At AIA Indiana, we want teachers, guidance counselors, school administrators, students and families to call us at 317-634-6993. We will bring a team to you so tomorrow's leaders can learn how architecture is more than simply "designing buildings." Architecture offers tomorrow's leaders a channel to create structures and places that can serve our communities, heal environments and elevate the human condition.

Throughout our diverse state, from urban centers to rural communities, there is a wealth of talent in our young people. Join us, as together, we encourage and grow the architects of the future.
