# Month x Month

## 2025 Program Highlights

Our programs invited members to BUILD BEYOND familiar boundaries while deepening knowledge and strengthening connections across our design community. Each gathering reflected our commitment to elevating

the practice of architecture through meaningful dialogue, diverse perspectives, and experiences that highlighted the continued growth and evolution of our profession.

### JAN . . .

Members began 2025 with a look into the origins of the Circle of Lights festival. Lisa Hendrickson shared the story of her grandfather, architect Edward D. Pierre, FAIA, and his influential role in shaping both the beloved holiday tradition and significant Indiana landmarks, including the Indiana State Library and Bush Stadium. DKGR hosted the program at its office overlooking Monument Circle.

### FEB . . .

Members, sponsors, and guests came together for a program at CAP: Indy focused on legal considerations within Indiana's design and construction industry. Presenters offered guidance on contracts, liability, and insurance practices that support strong and informed architectural work. Participants also engaged in meaningful discussion around risk and responsibility.

### MAR . . .

Dr. James Glass presented research from Volume 1 of his book, *Architecture in Indianapolis*, which explores the city's early architectural development from 1820 to 1900. He highlighted the abundance of Italianate commercial buildings and residences that defined the era. Stenz hosted the program at its Roosevelt Avenue location in the historic North Mass District.

### APR . . .



Panelists discussed how common architectural practices impact their disciplines and shared strategies to overcome project challenges. Panelists included an owner's representative, general contractor, structural engineer, landscape architect, and specialty subcontractor. bo-mar Industries hosted the program at its Beech Grove shop.

### MAY . . .

AIA Indianapolis held its annual Day at IMS with support from event sponsor Patterson Horth. More than 350 attendees enjoyed food, fellowship, and several continuing education opportunities. The gathering continued its tradition as a favorite spring event and provided a memorable experience during race month in Indy.

### JUN . . .

Members toured the SIGNWORKS production shop and participated in a continuing education session highlighting the company's operations. Attendees explored all areas of the facility. They also learned how the building's signage supports training and celebrates the organization's history. The tour also offered an engaging look at fabrication methods and industry craftsmanship.



From behind-the-scenes tours and leadership visits to civic-scale projects, media insights, preservation dialogue, and celebration, programming in 2025 reinforced connection, learning, and momentum.

### JUL ...

The July program took place at the Indiana Historical Society. David Shaffer, AIA, of RATIO, along with members of the firm's interior design team, discussed the building's design, function, and architectural form. The presentation gave attendees a deeper understanding of the project's history and significance to the city's cultural landscape.

### AUG ...

AIA National President Evelyn Lee, FAIA, visited Indianapolis to meet with members and share her perspectives on leadership, the future of practice, and national priorities shaping the profession. Her visit created a meaningful opportunity for local engagement and was well-received by members.

### SEP ...

Members, sponsors, and guests received an in-depth update from RATIO on the Signia by Hilton and Convention Center Expansion project. Presenters covered design strategies, project challenges, and the broader civic impact of this major investment. Brandt Construction hosted the program at its St. Joseph Street office in downtown Indianapolis.

### OCT ...



## WALTER S. BLACKBURN AWARD



### HEATHER ZETO, LEED AP BD+C, O+M, WELL AP

For more than two decades, Heather Zeto has helped Indiana build beyond conventional expectations in sustainable design. As Sustainability Practice Leader at Guidon, she has guided more than 65 LEED-certified projects and now leads a growing team advancing more than 20 active LEED efforts, sustainability plans, and feasibility studies. Her expertise has shaped transformative work at the IU Health Academic Health Center, Purdue University, and the Eskenazi Health campus, where she turns complex performance goals into clear and attainable strategies that elevate project outcomes.

Heather's impact extends far beyond project delivery. A longtime leader within USGBC Indiana and a two-time Greenbuild Advisory Board member, she has mentored emerging professionals, developed best practices, and shared her Practical Sustainability™ approach at conferences across the region. Her people-centered leadership and unwavering commitment to resilience and well-being exemplify the spirit of the Walter S. Blackburn Award.

## NEXT GEN AWARD



### CASS PARKER, AIA

Cass Parker is an emerging leader whose creativity, mentorship, and community focus are elevating the profession. Within Young Architects Forum (YAF) Indianapolis, she helped reinvigorate the group and co-leads a biweekly Architect Registration Examination (ARE) Study Group that supports dozens of licensure candidates. Her leadership extends into civic life as a commissioner on the Southport Redevelopment Commission, where she contributes to a \$19 million downtown development, and as a Big Sister with Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Indiana.

Finally, she is a Christopher Kelley Leadership Development Program Scholar with six divisions completed.

## TONY COSTELLO YOUNG ARCHITECT AWARD

### CHASE MILLER, AIA, NCARB, AHCA, EDAC

Chase Miller is a healthcare architect who continues to build beyond traditional practice by uniting professional expertise with deeply personal insight. After supporting his wife through years of medical care, he witnessed how design shapes healing and human experience. That perspective guides his leadership of Guidon's planning team, where he advances projects such as the new Community Health Network Westfield Hospital



and master planning efforts for IU Health and Eskenazi Health. In 2023, he became the youngest architect in Indiana to earn Board Certification from the American College of Healthcare Architects.

Chase's influence extends across the profession. He has held leadership roles with AIA Indianapolis and AIA Indiana, co-chaired The Center for Health Design's Environmental Standards Council, and contributed to updates of the FGI Guidelines. Through mentorship, advocacy, and civic engagement, including participation in the Stanley K. Lacy Executive Leadership Series, he continues to elevate the impact of healthcare design. His clarity, positivity, and passion reflect the spirit of the Tony Costello Young Architect Award.

## AIA INDIANA ARCHITECTURE OUTSTANDING SERVICE AWARD

### BRANDON FARLEY, AIA

Brandon leads American Structurepoint's education practice, where he brings together sustainability, innovation, and mentorship to create learning environments that help students thrive. His commitment to nurturing the next generation is most visible in his leadership of AIA Indiana's High School Architectural Design Competition.

For the past several years, Brandon has served as chair of this statewide program, often described as the Architecture State Championship. Under his guidance, the competition has continued its mission of building beyond classroom learning by challenging students to think critically, creatively, and collaboratively about real-world design problems.

Brandon is deeply hands-on, engaging with students throughout the process, recruiting architects to participate, and ensuring each student receives meaningful feedback from practicing professionals. His interactive approach allows participants to experience the full arc of design—from concept to critique—while reinforcing the importance of mentorship in architectural education.


Thanks to his leadership, the competition has reached hundreds of students across Indiana, strengthening the link between education and practice and inspiring future architects to imagine what is possible.

### JONATHAN R. HESS, AIA

Jonathan R. Hess, AIA, has shaped the cultural and architectural identity of Indiana for more than four decades. As past Principal and Chairman of the Board at Browning Day, his portfolio includes some of the state's most recognizable landmarks. From the Eiteljorg Museum of American Indians and

Known for his inclusive and collaborative approach, he has guided projects that exceed expectations, reflecting his belief that architecture is fundamentally about serving people. His legacy is one of vision, humility, and impact, shaping iconic public spaces while also crafting quieter works that seamlessly blend into their surroundings. In honoring Jonathan Hess with the AIA Indiana Gold Medal, the profession recognizes both his extraordinary body of work and his enduring influence on future generations of architects.

Founded in 1995 by Drew White and Kevin Cooper, the studio embraced the belief that architecture and interiors are inseparable and that design excellence should be accessible, contextual, and transformative for the communities it serves. Its award-winning portfolio—including the Cummins LiveWell Center, Julia M. Carson Transit Center, The Nature Conservancy headquarters, and numerous civic, cultural, and workplace projects—has played a defining role in shaping the city’s architectural identity and contributing to its vitality.

The firm’s commitment to mentorship and community impact is equally significant. From co-founding a summer architecture camp with Ball State University to supporting organizations such as CICF, Goodwill Industries, and the ACLU of Indiana, studioAXIS demonstrates that design is a public act with the power to uplift. With a thoughtful leadership transition underway, the studio is investing in the next generation while continuing to engage nationally and globally through collaborations with partner studios in Bangkok and Bangalore. For three decades, studioAXIS has exemplified design excellence, professional service, and civic pride, earning its recognition as the 2025 AIA Indiana Distinguished Firm.

# News & Updates

From project tours and member recognition to national leadership visits and engagement with the media, AIA Indianapolis remained active with issues shaping the profession and the community throughout 2025.

**AIA MEMBER SPOTLIGHTED FOR INSPIRING FUTURE ARCHITECTS**

AIA Indianapolis member Kionna Walker, AIA, was featured by WISH-TV for founding and leading Next Great Architects, a mission-driven initiative that has introduced more than 7,000 Indiana students to architecture. Founded in 2014, the program partners with schools, libraries, and community organizations to provide mentorship, hands-on experiences, and exposure to real-world design. Walker focuses on making architecture accessible to students from diverse and underserved communities, while helping them envision a future in the profession. She also expands this impact through her children’s book series, *Jamila Pearl, the Architect Girl*, which teaches young readers to think like architects.

**TOUR HIGHLIGHTS NEW INDIANA STATE ARCHIVES BUILDING**

AIA Indianapolis members received an inside look at the nearly complete Indiana State Archives Building during the July program. Led by RATIO and Pepper Construction, the tour highlighted the building’s design vision, its zero-lot urban site, and the use of BIM to coordinate the enclosure system. Attendees also learned how the new facility will safeguard Indiana’s historic records while improving visitor and staff experience. The program drew more than 70 participants, reflecting continued strong interest in project tours and behind-the-scenes learning opportunities.



These highlights reflect how the chapter continues to build beyond its programs to inform, connect, and elevate architectural practice across Indiana.

**MEET THE MEDIA PROGRAM OFFERS INSIGHT INTO INDUSTRY TRENDS**

AIA Indianapolis hosted a Meet the Media program in October led by Lara Beck of Beck Communications and featuring journalists Mickey Shuey of the *Indianapolis Business Journal* and Lindsey Erdody of *Axios Indianapolis*. Members learned about emerging industry trends, the growing influence of AI in reporting, and what makes a compelling architecture or development story. The discussion also offered a look ahead at how local media professionals anticipate covering the built environment in the coming years, giving architects valuable insight into effective storytelling and community engagement.

**THE AIA INDIANA EMERGING PROFESSIONAL (EP) FRIENDLY/EXEMPLARY FIRM RECOGNITION**

The AIA Indiana Emerging Professional (EP) Friendly/Exemplary Firm Recognition is a newly established annual designation approved by the AIA Indiana Board of Directors.

This program celebrates firms that provide exceptional support and opportunities for early professionals. It also aims to foster dialogue among firms across the state to encourage the development of policies and practices that promote innovation, professional growth, and progressive workplaces for future members of the design profession.

An early professional (EP) is defined as an architectural staff member who has been working in the profession for 10 years or less and falls into one of the following categories: recent graduate or unlicensed emerging professional.

This recognition provides a clearer, more accessible path for individuals pursuing licensure. Firms may receive one of two designations: AIA Indiana EP Friendly Firm or AIA Indiana EP Exemplary Firm.

**WOMEN IN ARCHITECTURE CONTINUES TO STRENGTHEN PROFESSIONAL CONNECTIONS**

Three years into its revival, the AIA Indianapolis Women in Architecture Committee continued to build a strong network of support for women in the profession. Throughout the year, the group hosted a variety of events, including Speed Networking at Ball State's CAP: Indy, PechaKucha-style presentations centered on the theme "YES and," and informal gatherings such as a lunch at The AMP at 16 Tech. The year concluded with the third annual Gingerbread Decorating event at American Structurepoint. Together, these programs created opportunities for connection, shared experience, and collaboration, reinforcing WIA's role in advancing community and leadership among women architects in Indianapolis.



**YOUNG ARCHITECTS FORUM BUILDS COMMUNITY FOR EMERGING PROFESSIONALS**

The AIA Indianapolis Young Architects Forum experienced another active year, offering programming designed to connect and support architects in the early stages of their careers. Events ranged from professional development opportunities such as ARE study sessions and educational webinars, to social gatherings, including Fever and Indiana games and the annual Breakfast with AIA Indy Fellows. Chaired by Logan Gemmill, AIA, of RQAW|DCCM and Shraddha Shetty, Assoc. AIA, of Luminaut, YAF Indy focused on fostering meaningful peer connections during a pivotal career phase. By creating spaces for collaboration, mentorship, and shared learning, the group continues to provide an essential support network that empowers emerging professionals to navigate the profession with confidence.

DELV Design received a Citation Award for the new Fishers Municipal Center, which creates a welcoming civic hub with transparent, community-forward design. The project enhances public engagement and reflects the city's evolving identity through thoughtful form and function. **C**

Fowler Academic Building / Merit Award**

**Carmel Clay Public Library / Citation Award**

## NEW CONSTRUCTION COST GREATER THAN \$25 MILLION

**Eskenazi Health Thomas + Arlene Grande Campus – Honor Award**  
arcDESIGN earned an Honor Award for a LEED Silver campus that expands access to care in Indianapolis' Northeast Corridor. Jurors praised its intuitive planning, community-centered outdoor spaces, and calming, art-filled environment that supports dignity, wellness, and neighborhood revitalization. **A**

**OrthoIndy Brownsburg – Citation Award**  
arcDESIGN earned a Citation Award for OrthoIndy Brownsburg, an efficient multispecialty facility with clear circulation, evidence-based planning, and a distinctive exterior reflecting the brand. Jurors highlighted its warm, non-institutional interiors and strong alignment with the Framework for Design Excellence. **D**

## ADAPTIVE REUSE / RENOVATION / INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE

**Columbus Regional Health at Nexus Park – Citation Award**  
BSA/RSP earned a Citation Award for transforming a former shopping mall into a vibrant healthcare campus. Jurors commended its daylight-filled central corridor, clear clinical organization, and honest approach to adaptive reuse that preserves memory while elevating patient experience. **E**

**Riley Maternity Tower at Riley Hospital for Children – Honor Award**  
BSA received an Honor Award for the Riley Maternity Tower renovation, which unifies obstetric, neonatal, and postpartum care into one cohesive environment. Jurors praised its light-filled atrium, calming design motif, and exceptional coordination across a complex clinical setting. **B**

## HEALTHCARE PLANNING / APPLIED RESEARCH

**Columbus Regional Health at Nexus Park – Merit Award**  
BSA earned a Merit Award for data-driven planning at Nexus Park, using advanced simulation to optimize flow, efficiency, and staffing. Jurors highlighted the project as a clear example of research-informed design that strengthens outcomes and supports sustainable, patient-centered care. **C**
